

# SUBJECT & OBJECT PRONOUNS

Subject and object pronouns are personal pronouns. They are:

		SUBJECT PRONOUNS	OBJECT PRONOUNS
<b>S I N G U L A R</b>	1st person	<b>I</b>	<b>me</b>
	2nd person	<b>You</b>	<b>you</b>
	3rd person	<b>He</b>	<b>him</b>
	3rd person	<b>She</b>	<b>her</b>
	3rd person	<b>It</b>	<b>it</b>
<b>P L U R A L</b>	1st person	<b>We</b>	<b>us</b>
	2nd person	<b>You</b>	<b>you</b>
	3rd person	<b>They</b>	<b>them</b>

We use personal pronouns to replace nouns when it is clear who or what we are talking about:

- We use subject pronouns as the subjects of verbs. We use them before a verb.

*My father isn't at home. He is at work.  
Where is Peter?. He's in the kitchen.  
Maria isn't from Spain. She's from Italy.*

**IMPORTANT:** We must always use a subject in English

*They are coming > ~~Are coming~~      It's hot today > ~~Is hot today~~*

- We use object pronouns as the objects of verbs and prepositions. We use them after a verb or prep.

Verb + Object pronoun:      *Maria is very nice. I like her.  
There is my brother. Can you see him?*

Preposition + Object pronoun:      *She talked to me yesterday.  
Where's Maria?. We're waiting for her.*



IMPORTANT: We don't normally leave out object pronouns in English.

*Peter is horrible. I don't like him. > ~~I don't like.~~*
