

Scripture Illustrated

1. Read through the 4 scripture passages for the week you have been assigned.
2. Choose a memorable or meaningful line or part of a line from one of the passages. Make sure you write down the book, chapter, and verse so you can properly cite the scripture on your poster.
3. Plan out what your poster will look like. You will create a rectangular illustrated poster of the verse (Mr. Smith will give you the paper)– so you need to use a sheet of scratch paper to plan out your lettering, spacing, and artwork.
4. Create your poster. Be sure to include:
 - Decorative scripture verse in a font style that matches the meaning of the scripture
 - Citation (book, chapter, verse) usually smaller than verse!
 - Illustration or clip art that enhances or reinforces the message.
 - Visually appealing border.

Scripture Illustrated Evaluation

Your illustrated scripture poster will be graded on the following criteria:

- Scripture passage is written accurately (spelling, etc.)
- Scripture citation is accurate (chapter, book, verse).
- Scripture verse is written or typed in a font style that matches the meaning of the scripture.
- Illustration or clip art enhances or reinforces the message.
- Visually appealing border.
- Use of color or grayscale shading to enhance visual appeal.
- Text, artwork, and border work together in the layout to emphasize the power of God's word in our lives.
